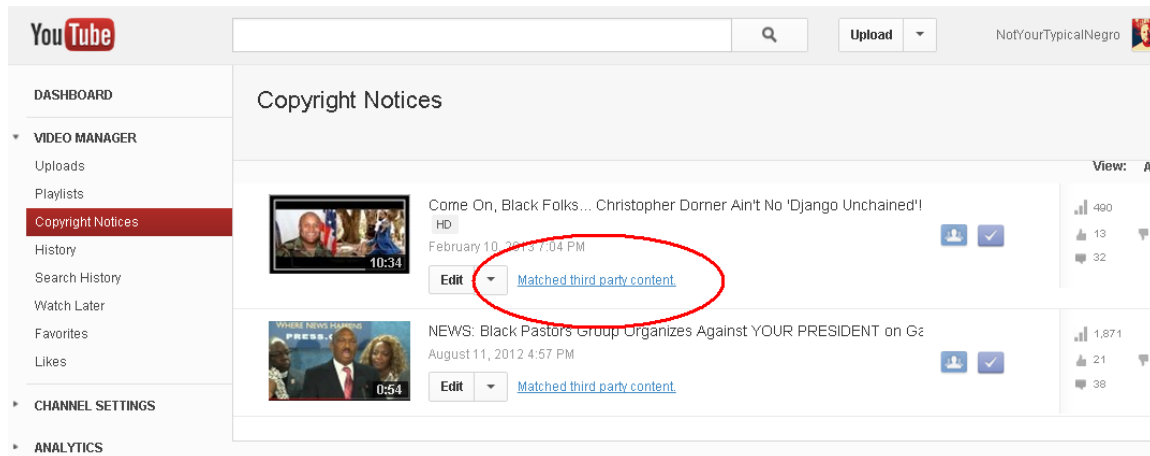
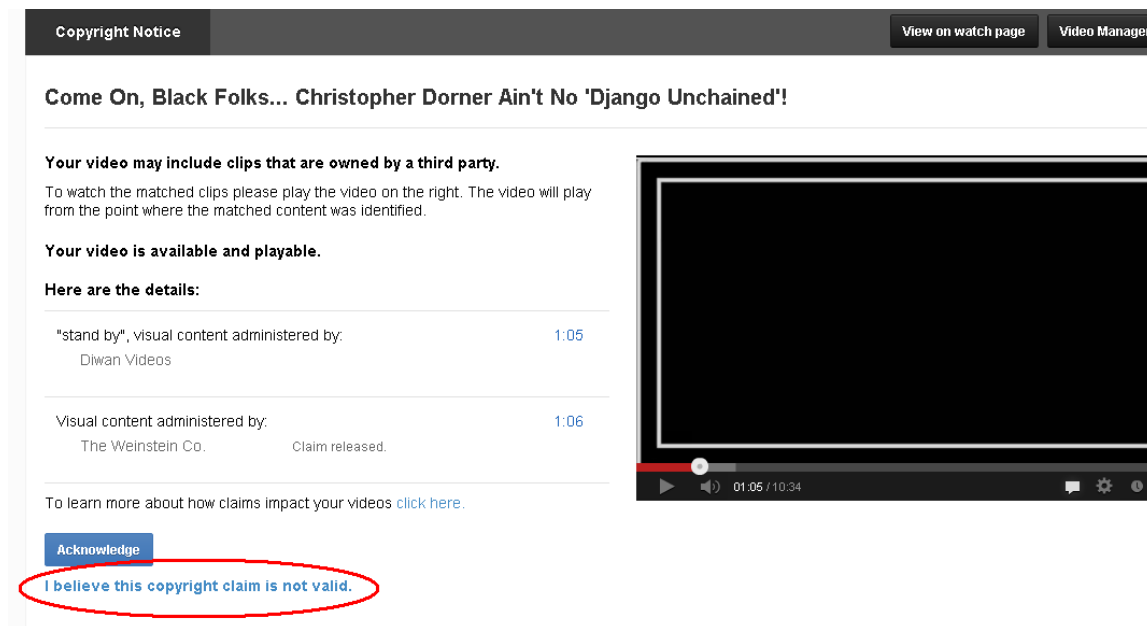


How To Respond To A YouTube Copyright Notice or Strike


STEP 1: Access Video Manager, the Copyright Notices and click the hyperlink.



STEP 2: Click the hyperlink "I believe this copyright claim is not valid."




STEP 3: Select the option, "My use of the content meets the legal requirements for fair use..." and click Continue.
